### ABDO College busy at Optrafair 2013




Optrafair 2013 attracted 6,600 individual visitors and the ABDO College stand was busy throughout the three days of the exhibition.

## Positive response to the first Supporting Academic Learning event

The 'Supporting Academic Learning' event is one of five new projects currently being undertaken by the partnership of ABDO College and Canterbury Christ Church University (CCCU) funded by a grant from the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE).

The first one-day event took place in April at the NEC, Birmingham. It featured lectures and workshops designed for three specific groups, consisting of practice-based supervisors, personal distance learning tutors and practice support team visitors.

The speakers included Linda Ford, head of education and standards at the GOC, Lindsey Keefe, placement lead for the occupational therapy pathway at CCCU, Alicia Thompson, ABDO's director of professional examinations and from ABDO College, head of operational services Michelle Derbyshire, lecturer Gillian Elstub and Principal Jo Underwood.

The event also featured presentations from two former ABDO College students, Marc Farmer and Anna Foden, who highlighted how they, their practice and patients have significantly benefitted from their successful participation in the ABDO College/CCCU ophthalmic dispensing degree progamme.

Delegates have subsequently provided constructive and useful feedback which will assist the College in planning future events; it is evident from the positive comments received that they found the event informative, enjoyable and well worthwhile.



## Ophthalmic Lenses Availability New 2013 edition now published

Optrafair 2013 saw the release of the new edition of the popular ABDO College publication *Ophthalmic Lenses Availability*. Edited by Phil & Pat Gilbert, this latest edition contains an increase in the number of lenses that are currently available in the UK and has grown by a further 45 pages. This growth not only comes from an additional number of freeform progressive lenses, but also a rise in



both photochromic and polarising products. Growth can also be seen in products such as vocational lenses and new pre-presbyopia offerings.

Overall the number of lenses now available to the UK optical profession has grown by a further 20 per cent in comparison to 2012, but this represents a massive increase of 66 per cent over 2009 availability. The chart herewith shows just how new technology and new designs have made significant inroads into the choice that the profession now has to offer their patient base. For those practitioners that are still clinging onto the old 2009 edition there are now over 630 new lens types listed, and, even if you purchased the 2012 edition there are now a further 260 new products. Not only are the new lens types listed, there are also a higher number of pages devoted to the very useful micro-engravings used increasingly by lens manufacturers. As new manufacturing processes lead to more flexibility in design the need to identify product, not only by design, but by refractive index and often corridor length, is becoming more important in everyday practice.

## Launch of new webinar initiative

The new webinar initiative is another one of the five new projects (also see the 'Supporting Academic Learning event' feature in this issue), funded by a grant from the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE), undertaken by the ABDO College and Canterbury Christ Church University partnership.

The first in a series of one-hour webinars, will take place at 7.00pm on Thursday 20 June and will be presented by Professor Darren Shickle, Head of the Academic Unit of Public Health, Institute of Health Sciences at the University of Leeds. The webinar will discuss the interface between the optical sector and public health agenda and present the findings of focus groups about public attitudes to testing. The contribution that dispensing opticians can make to the vision health of the nation will also be highlighted.
